COMPETITION

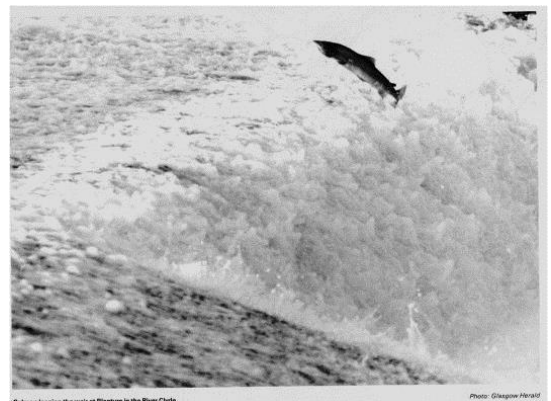


The Salmon Homecoming project celebrates the removal of barriers to fish migration on the Avon Water, where fish ladders have been built at the Ferniegair and Millheugh Weirs. Fish passage is important as it enables migratory fish species to reach spawning areas to complete their life cycle.

Imagine you were in charge of designing a fish pass for a weir or dam. What would it look like and how would it work? There's lots of information online about fish passage engineering but we'd like you to be as creative and original as possible - fun ideas welcome!

- 4) Closing date: **Wed 31st May**



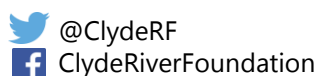
Salmon leaping the weir at Blantyre in the River Clyde.
