Can you identify our native from our invasive non-native species? If not then this short introductory workshop is for you!

INNS OUT is a project partnership between Clyde River Foundation, Clyde and Avon Valley Partnership and Central Scotland Green Network which aims to:

- Educate people about these species
- Map species distribution and abundance
- Develop a strategic eradication programme

We are running a series of outdoor workshops (approx. 90 mins) which are **FREE** to attend and **open to all**. Just wear suitable outdoor clothes

and boots, and we will show you how to identify three of our most invasive non-native plant species and what to do if you find them. The workshops will cover:

- **Japanese knotweed**
- **Himalayan balsam**
- **Giant hogweed**
